Annual Meeting for First Congregational United Church of Christ April 15, 2018 at 11 AM Meeting was called to order by Moderator Erik Gamerl. A quorum was declared.

Opening prayer was given by Pastor Jackie Perry. A welcome was given by Erik Gamerl.

Reports had been handed out to all members previously for their viewing. It was moved by Scott Williams and seconded by Randy Neuharth to accept reports. Vote was unanimous to accept.

Rev. Jackie Perry reported details for her to take a 3-month sabbatical in 2019. It will be a time of spiritual renewal for her. She will be looking at how the Quakers practice discernment and how to lead the community and congregation in a time of renewal. She will attend some Quaker meetings. Our congregation wants to review with a new pastor as a substitute who is fresh out of seminary. We will advertise for someone. The grant she applied for is for \$15,000 to pay for the substitute minister's salary and expenses for the 3 months. She mailed the application on April 14. We should hear the decision regarding the grant by the end of August 2018.

The budget for the year was given with 27 pledges totaling \$105,889 for the year. This is about \$35,000 less than expected expenses. We will continue saving expenses wherever possible and trust that God will help us meet our needs as they are presented. The motion to accept the budget was given by Calvin Allyn to accept the budget and seconded by Scott Williams. Motion carried.

Pastor's Annual Report 2019

There is much to cheer in the past year. Our winter worship series, "Drawn In" celebrated God's creativity through the eyes and insights of guest artist, Lonn Atwater. Ben D. Anderson, UCC Commissioned Minister for Disabilities Awareness from SD, invited us to widen our welcome of people who are different. Chaplain Gordon Braun of ASERA Care frequently preached when I was away. We celebrated Organ Donor Sunday. We held joint services with First Presbyterian and Trinity Episcopal Churches, as well as VBS and an Easter Egg Hunt. I participated in the ministerial association sponsored Evening of Prayer and Support held at First United Methodist Church Norfolk after major flooding.

Support Team hired our new part-time custodian. We welcomed Chris Storm in February. As I write, tulips have emerged in the revitalized parking-lot garden funded by memorial money.

Our neighbors at Skyline Apartments celebrated the completion of extensive renovations, and our youth began providing ice-cream socials in their community room. We plan to do some light gardening there soon.

A former FCUCC member, who now attends Countryside UCC in Omaha, reached out to us on behalf of a humanitarian effort in O'Neill. First United Methodist Church O'Neill set up a food pantry and fund to assist 60 families affected by August ICE raids. FCUCC volunteers delivered coats donated by Orphan Grain Train, and items for the pantry. FCUCC sends donations each month as they come in marked "O'Neill".

As I write this report, I eagerly anticipate the celebration of our church's 150th birthday in 2020. On May 15, 1870, a group of ten English-speaking Christians met with Rev. J.W. Kidder and Colonel Charles Mathewson to organize "First Congregational Church". This Spring an action team will form to plan ways to make this anniversary special.

It takes time and forethought to plan a 150th anniversary. In January 2018, a small group of quilters invited the whole congregation to be part of the 150th anniversary quilt. They invited friends and members to select a scripture-based quilt block on behalf of their families. By late summer they had all the blocks needed. The quilt now hangs in the narthex on permanent display. This beautiful artwork with layers of meaning, also fixes our attention on the upcoming anniversary. I rejoice and celebrate all that God has done, and continues to do, in and through First Congregational United Church of Christ. Peace, *Pastor Jackie*.

ANNUAL REPORT OF FAITH DEVELOPMENT MINISTRY TEAM

April 2018-March 2019

The Faith Development Ministry Team of First Congregational United Church of Christ in Norfolk, Nebraska, has set aside the first Sunday of every month following regular church services for the regular meeting time. We meet in the Unity Room. Members include: Katie Gamerl, Barb Koenig (Council Representative), Darlene Korthals (Presiding Chair), Kay Neuharth (Secretary), Stacie Uzzell, and Pastor Jackie.

Each year brings changes and challenges as we continue to provide educational opportunities for all groups. We offer Sunday School classes to Pre-K, youth, and adults. All meet at 9:00 am prior to the 10:15 am church services. An adult book club meets monthly on the second Wednesday. Books featuring a selected theme are read and discussed followed by a noon meal.

Pastor Jackie and various volunteers have provided opportunities for the youth of our church. Youth have participated in fundraising projects, church services, collected supplies and volunteered at the Animal Shelter, provided social events at the Vet's Home and Skyline Apartments, baked cookies and caroled at Christmastime, participated in an Art Contest, helped with VBS and the Easter Egg Hunt.
