Annual Meeting, April 21, 2024, First Congregational United Church of Christ

Call to Order: The Annual Meeting was called to order on April 21, 2024, by Moderator Scott Williams at 10:45 a.m. A quorum was declared present.

Opening Prayer: Reverend Jackie Perry opened the meeting with prayer.

Blanket Acceptance of Yearly Reports: Scott Williams opened the reports up to questions. Ben Uzzell motioned to rename Budget as Financial Report. Tom McConnell seconded. Motion passed. Randy Neuharth motioned to blanket accept the following yearly reports as written. Erik Gamerl seconded. Motion passed.

The following reports are the yearly reports motioned to be accepted: Congregational Meeting Minutes, Pastor's Report, Clerk's Record, Historian's Report, Cradle Roll, Faith Development Ministry, Worship Ministry, Transformation Ministry, Financial Reports from: Memorial Fund, General Fund, Budget-changed to Financial Report.

Pastor's Moment by the Reverend Jackie Perry: Pastor Jackie's report was a highlight of her last 10 years at First Congregational United Church of Christ. The highlights were about strengthening our relationships.

Pastor Jackie is retiring June 30. Something she would like to have happen is to have a joint meal with the members of Linaje Escogido. Several Linaje leaders are professional musicians. They do go out on tour, probably leaving again in June. Pastor Jackie asked us to think of and find a date before the musicians go out on tour to have this meal. Perhaps a Wednesday, like the 22nd of May or a Sunday in early June, June 5 would work. Pastor Jackie will ask the Linaje leaders for workable dates. She will ask Sue Allyn to put out an email blast with a date.

For her final Sunday, June 30, Pastor Jackie requests just a cake for Fellowship time. She chooses to see the combined meal with Linaje as her more formal goodbye. "Perhaps it is time for us to cook for them." It was 4 1/2 years ago when members of FCUCC met with the Linaje members for a meal and to discuss the rental of portions of the basement of the church. Having a meal with both congregations together was also proposed at that time. Then Covid came along and a meal together never happened. In light of Pastor Jackie's retirement, a meal together would also reassure them that their place in our church is secure.

Nebraska Conference Deacon Elaine Miller will be present on June 30 for the formal ritual release of Pastor Jackie. Perhaps having a potluck and her requested cake, was suggested for Pastor Jackie's last Sunday.

Report on assistance from the conference for securing an interim minister. Rev. Jonna Jensen was the initial contact made by Scott Williams, Lori Williams, Erik Gamerl, and Ben Uzzell. She has medical issues and has retired. The four have met with a person who is possibly available as an interim minister for us. That gentleman is currently an interim at another church, so an offer to be our interim is not yet formalized. The interim minister would be a full time position. Once an interim is in place, there are steps to take, led by him and the conference, as to whether we have a full-time (or other time) settled minister.

Vote on the Proposed Budget: Moderator Scott Williams opened a discussion on the budget. Treasurer Lori Williams explained the new budget, April 2024-2025: pg. 24-25.

When we have our stewardship time and receive pledges, the number that is pledged is historically not the amount in the next year's proposed budget. We always give more than we pledge. This year, the 2024 - 2025 budget is based on the prior 2 years' actual giving, divided by 2. The amount proposed is a little higher than the pledges collected this year. The rent from Linaje is also a little higher this year, but that is recent increase was not reflected in the budget. The expenses were compared to the prior year. The expenses are based on what the real numbers were last year. The salary projected is what would be appropriate for an interim minister. As Pastor Jackie is soon retiring, there was no salary increase for her. There was an increase in salary for secretary, Sue Allyn.

A motion to accept the Proposed Budget was made by Jeanne Rix, 2nded by Brian Seier. Motion passed.

Vote on Nominations: Nominations for church offices were reviewed. Because of the steps needed to find a suitable interim minister, then discernment of the whole congregation as to expectations for a settled minister, Rev. Johna Jensen's was suggested, with the agreement of the Unity Council members that the current Unity Council leaders serve at least another year. Therefore, Nominated Officers are: Scott Williams, Moderator, Brian Seier, Vice Moderator, Erik Gamerl, Past Moderator, Lori Williams, Treasurer, and Jane Uzzell, Clerk. Sue Surber motioned for nominations to cease. Ben Uzzell seconded. Ben Uzzell then motioned to accept the nominations. Randy Neuharth, seconded. Motion passed.

Commissioning of Officers: Reverend Jackie Perry led the Commissioning of Officers, as found on page 27 of the annual report.

The Unity Council members are hereby reinstalled as officers. Congregation members are charged to support the officers as they serve this year in their positions.

Adjournment: Randy Neuharth motioned that the meeting be adjourned. Meeting was adjourned at 11:10 a.m..

Treasurer's Annual Report 2024

The generosity of our congregation is amazing! Once again, with your continued support, the financial position of the church is positive.

Balance Sheet

The cash position of the church continues to be stable. The balance of the savings account is higher than last year because a congregational member donated a part of their annual pledge in a lump sum. To simulate their normal monthly giving, an automated monthly transfer has been set up to move their regular giving amount from the savings account to the general fund.

Profit & Loss Previous Year Comparison

The fiscal year ended again with a positive income. With the increased and steadfast congregational offerings and the increased rental income of \$1,000 per month from Linaje Escogido, the overall income for the year continues to be healthy.

Total 515.0000 Church Maintenance: This category shows an increase of \$6,387.63 from the prior year which is primarily due to the repairs of the church windows. Thank you to the Memorial Committee for contributing to the general fund to help pay for the repairs. We also paid more in Groundskeeping for added snow removal this year. The insurance premium remained fairly constant this past year.

Profit & Loss Budget Overview

The budget was again prepared before the total pledges were received. Based on actual Current Pledges received in the prior two years, pledges were estimated at \$132,000. The minister's salary stayed the same due to the upcoming retirement in June. No change in Pastoral Services was estimated for an incoming interim minister. The church secretary's salary was increased for current inflation pending approval from the support committee.

Revenue budget numbers are very conservative, and the expense budget numbers were developed using actual numbers from the prior two years. The budget projects a loss of \$5,764 which is about half of the projected loss from the prior year. And yet, the overall profit has been a positive net income for the past several years!

With God's gifts through all of you, the church continues to survive in a healthy financial position. I am so proud to serve as the treasurer for our beautiful congregational family!
