What is God Doing in the Neighborhood?



On March 6th, Pastor Jackie, Merle Rix, and Chris Storm attended the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at **Skyline Apartments**. Thanks to a grant and many funding streams, the apartments were completely renovated and there are plans for some landscaping and a community garden. The Lt. Governor and Mayor spoke as well as other partners of Wishrock (owners). The 7 million dollar project was Wishrock's first in Nebraska and now our neighbors have nice renewed affordable housing. Planning and execution of the project took a total of four years.

We thank Wishrock for inviting First Congregational UCC to be part of the project with some light landscaping/gardening this spring and planning monthly community events. Our community events partners include Westridge UMC and Immaculata Monastery. Merle was on the original Board of Directors from the late 1960s until they sold the property in 1972. Our youth have served at two ice cream socials in their community room. In the picture, Kylie (Apt Manager) cuts the ribbon.

O'NEILL UPDATE - March 8, 2019

Good Morning!

Thank you for reaching out and sharing your journey. How God brings things together always amazes me!

We are still in the middle of assisting those left in need from the raid. We are gaining slowly in getting them back to work. We are currently feeding about 400 people from our pantry each week. About 60% of those are those still waiting for, praying for hearings to allow them to get back to work. We have succeeded in assisting about 50% of the immigrant family to get permission and paperwork allowing them to go back to work.

The community assistance fund has run dry for helping in terms of utilities and rent for those affected by the raid. I continue to look for ways to assist, but the ongoing work to provide food can be completely tiring. We are forever grateful for the partnership of Associated Grocers. I am concerned how long I can keep the ship moving forward. We get the food for free, but as you well know free isn't always free. There are costs associated with bringing the food to O'Neill. I continue to pray for God's providing of funds to cover this. And He is faithful, just not always in my timing! LOL

My prayer and hope is that by the end of May we have a great majority of our immigrant family back into the workforce thus restoring their self dignity, self respect and feeling they are contributing once again to the world that they are responsible for and living in.

Everything you have done and continue to do has been such a blessing to this on going ministry. Thank you so much for your support, your prayers and partnership as we continue to serve God by serving others.
