

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### **Biography**



I entered Eden Theological Seminary twenty years ago this month. When I began my education, my mentor and former pastor, Rev. Galen Peckham, said, "Read biographies". He told me how he loved reading stories about the lives of people; not only are they entertaining, but they help us reflect on our own lives.

This summer, I have had the pleasure of mentoring a new pastor in the area. Most basic to a pastor's education is a class on healthy relationships. We have been using a curriculum designed for clergy from the Faith Trust Institute designed to foster accountable and responsible leadership and healthy communities. Recently, we completed the section on self-care. In it was a list of ways leaders might care for themselves in healthy ways. One of the suggestions included: "Read a book every month."

The sentence prompted me to reflect on how often I read a book for pleasure; it was not once a month. I probably read three books a year for pleasure. But, as I began to list the books I have read in the past ten years, many of these were either biographies or autobiographies.

To my delight, many of the autobiographies were written by my friends. Some of the best included pastor and poet, Mary Avidano's memoir about three generations of her family: *In the House of I Am.* Nicola Mendenhall, a friend from Des Moines, wrote a unique memoir centered on her years in psychoanalysis titled *Fear, Folly, and Freud: A Psychotherapist in Psychoanalysis*.

After realizing that I wanted to read more books, I recently visited the Biography section of our public library. Displayed on a shelf was the book *Speak*, *Okinawa* by Elizabeth Miki Brina. The book was not about a famous person, and I knew nothing about Okinawa, so I checked it out. The author is the child of a Vietnam veteran and his Okinawan war bride.

The heartbreaking histories of Okinawa and the author's family are shocking, yet the humanity of the characters shines through. In a 2015 CBS Sunday morning interview with Jerry Seinfeld, the comedian said, "I don't want to be spared the grime." Most biographies that I have enjoyed have been a combination of grime and purity. After all, isn't this part of the human condition?

It seems to me that *The Bible* has a combination of grime and purity. It holds stories of how people experienced God. Their testimonies (Old and New Testaments) reveal the character of God through God's work in creation, provision, judgment, deliverance, covenant, and God's promises.

The Bible's account of the whole course of Jesus life, death, and resurrection shows us how people experienced God in their time, in the light of God's nature, justice, faithfulness, mercy, and love.

Does your summer reading include any biographies? You might enjoy browsing the Biography section at the library!




#### **New Curriculum for Sunday School**


