"They will know we are Christians by our Love"



Well, I did it. After ten years, I locked myself out of my car and duplex as I was heading out for an 8:00 a.m. ministerial meeting at the monastery. You know that sinking feeling when you discover that you have locked yourself out? I had no spare keys in my garage. I couldn't call my landlord because my phone was in my purse locked in the duplex. There was still too much snow and ice to try to walk to the church. What to do?

I really wanted to get to the meeting, because I was the one who set it up and I had not seen the sisters for many months; I was so looking forward to seeing them. Then I spotted a neighbor's car with its lights on as if it was being remotely heated. I knew that these neighbors had lived in the ranch house for many years on my cul-de-sac, but I had never met them or spoken with them.

I walked through the slushy snow on the road, and up their driveway. As I was about to reach their door, it opened, and out came a smiling teenager, a woman, and a man—all smiling. I told them my trouble, and asked if they could give me a ride to the church. They heartily agreed! First, they delivered the teen to the high school, and then, they dropped me off at the church. I was glad to see Sue's van parked in the church parking lot, because I had no key to get in.

Sue was able to give me a ride to the monastery, and I was only 10 minutes late for the meeting. I call it a "meeting", but it is more "a fellowship". We share some coffee and rolls and something of our ministry and lives "that moves us to glorify God". I was so happy to see Sr. Celine, Sr. Hilde, and Sr. Micheal Marie. I had missed them for many months and was reminded of their warm welcome.

After the gathering, I asked another clergy friend to drop me off at the church, which he gladly did. Once at the church, I realized that I didn't have my landlords' phone numbers; they were on my locked-up phone! Nor did I have numbers for neighbors who would have the landlords' phone numbers. Then, I remembered Darlene knew my landlords. I called her and she was able to give me a landline phone number. I left a message for that number and hoped they were in town.

Before it was all done around 10:00, Sue had given me a couple more rides to the duplex: one to get the cell phone number from my duplex "roof-mate", and another to finally meet my landlord at the duplex to let me in.

I felt vulnerable asking for so much help from others, but discovered they all went out of their way to graciously help me. At our ministerial gathering, after Sr. Michael Marie's devotional, she played "They will know we are Christians by our love". We all sang with the recording, and wondered how we can show love to people. I had so many examples before it was even 10 a.m. to give glory to God!


