The Request: John Else from the League of Women Voters Nebraska (LWV-N) asked to meet with me in mid-December. The League was looking for a place to hold a public meeting about LB 216, a legislative bill on Redistricting. Redistricting is the process of redrawing of electoral districts. These need to be adjusted every 10 years, and should not be drawn to favor any political party, person or group; to this end, LWV wanted to hold a meeting in Norfolk to educate and advocate for LB 216 (its a voter related bill). The League held meetings in Kearney and Hastings with 100 and 40 attending.


My experience with LWV: I was a member of the League in Pennsylvania in the 80s. Back then, we were studying the Farm Crisis as a focus topic. Because the League is well-known to be non-partition, we had permission to help people in nursing homes vote (I did this for a couple of years). We also set up public forums that gave those running for office a place to address questions from the voters in an equal and orderly setting. We would also send questions for all candidates to complete and from these create voters guides that the Newspaper would publish. Their link: http://www.lwv-ne.org/


My point of view (you are free to disagree with me)

- **-Experience:** From my own *experience*, I know the non-partisan work of the LWV, who educate and advocate on behalf of all voters.
- **-Scripture:** (James 2:14-17) As Christians we need to do more than pray for our nation and community we also need to act (in this case action through hospitality).
- **-Theological Themes:** In our 2014 church conversations *Around the Table* we identified as our top values: Caring, Compassion, Welcome, Community Service & Christian Unity. It seems to me, that inviting LWV-N to meet at FCUCC would put our values in action, especially Welcome and Community Service (and also Christian Unity because this is a non-partisan group).
- **-Tradition:** Congregationalists, historically value education (we founded Harvard and Yale), in our local church we have created a generous scholarship fund, and among our members we have had many teachers and principals. Historically, we have participated as community leaders in the public square. There is no place where we see God not present. Because we value unity, I sought approval for this request from Unity Council and others. One person said, "Our church has always been known as a place where you can have a conversation." Another said, "When LWV-N was studying water issues they made many requests of NRD for information, and they were always fair with us."
- **-Shared Art work:** FCUCC's favored church art works show Jesus knocking. When the community knocks on our door, if it is at all possible to accommodate a request, I'd like to try.


