With love and faith

Around 3:30 am, the police dispatcher called me to ask if First Congregational Church was the shelter for the high-rise apartments. I answered, "Yes". She explained that there was a fire at 1204 Norfolk Avenue; that there were lots of people outside; and it might rain soon, so could our church open its doors? "Yes", I replied. By the time I arrived, the parking lot was full of cars with many people waiting under the canopy. Public Safety Director, Shane Weidner, greeted me in the parking lot. I unlocked the doors, and turned on the lights as people began to slowly stream in.

Fire fighters continued to deliver people to our door. Some with no shoes. Some in their night clothes. A few evacuees carried cats. Kari, a Red Cross Volunteer, asked me to make copies of a form. Neighbor and evacuee, Richard, offered to make coffee. Kari arranged for Hy-Vee to bring in muffins and donuts; we were in business.

As folks settled in, many grew concerned about leaving medicines and pets behind without food. After the fire was extinguished, Shane asked Kari to take names, so the fire fighters could take people in groups of three to their apartments in order to retrieve medicine or tend to animals. I admired the experience and guidance of Shane, Kari, and the fire fighters. I appreciated Richard's help with the coffee. After he discovered that the coffeemaker was leaking, he cleaned the counter, while custodian, Chris, mopped the floor. Chris had been displaced, too.

Before daybreak, I called church members to come in to serve, or bring socks, ice, or more coffee cups. Buy 6:00am, they started to arrive. I was proud of my church as they greeted and served 60 plus guests for 16 hours that day. With a dozen cots from the Fire Department, and 40 inflatable mattresses from Captain Jesus of the Salvation Army, we created quiet areas to nap. We also prepared to provide lodging for the night. When our neighbors could return home remained a question mark.

Hy-Vee delivered sandwiches for lunch and the Salvation Army supplied a hot supper for the guests. After the meal, Skyline Apartment management read the names and apartments numbers of those who could go home. Half would be returning home, and half would be going to hotels. As I write this, fifty-two people are still living in hotel rooms.

Pastor Donna Goltry and another person from Westridge United Methodist Church volunteered to stay the night if needed; a few of our members stood ready to stay over as well. In the end, we didn't need the 'night-shift' since all our guests had departed by 7:00 pm. I was thankful for those who volunteered to extend night hospitality if needed. As guests departed, two more members came to help clean-up. By 8:00 pm, you couldn't tell that anything had happened.

There was much smoke and water damage at the apartments. We later learned that had it not been for the sprinkler system, lives may have been lost. God provided for our neighbors, and even their pets. Someone thought to bring kitty-litter; and with the help of a large flat Amazon box, we had created the 'cat room' in the old north entrance.

I continue to reflect on that day of ministry, and how God supplied our needs. The primary artworks in our church are pictures of Jesus knocking at night. I'm glad Jesus knocked on our door. It was an opportunity to get to know our neighbors and serve God by serving others.

Eventually, Pharaoh felt threatened by the number of Israelites in Egypt and began to put them in forced work cities, oppressing them and eventually enslaving them. Mike chose this block for visual reasons—he liked the colors and the image of roses. He has loved roses since he was a boy. He remembers the smell of roses at his grandmother's funeral at the church in Pierce, Nebraska. To this day, roses remind him of his grandmother, so he is pleased with how the block turned out.
