Teachers

In her book, The Basics of Christian Education, Professor Karen Tye writes: "Why do we educate in the community of faith? We educate so the community will be rooted in and faithful to its past (continuity) <u>and</u> open to the present and future as God calls us forth into new life (change). It is not an either/or choice, focusing on either continuity or change. Instead, it is both/and, seeing both continuity and change as essential to the church's life and future."

Jesus' own teaching ministry was marked by continuity and change. At his first "lecture" series in the Gospel of Matthew called the Sermon on the Mount, Chapter 5, Jesus tells the people:

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

Jesus stood in the continuity of Jewish teachers, yet in verses 21 & 22, and in several other points in this section, he says:

"You have heard that it was said...But I say to you..." These are the words of change. You may have been taught this, but now I am teaching you this."

"Continuity and change. Jesus' teaching ministry was an ongoing call for Jewish people to return to their roots, to the heart of their law; <u>and</u> it was clearly an invitation to change, transformation, to living life in a new way that would bring justice and mercy to all. In our own education for discipleship we can do no less!," writes Professor Tye.

On Sunday, May 7, we celebrated those of us who had answered the call to teach in the church this past year. During the Early Word, I also invited the congregation to think of a teacher in their life, what made that person special, and to share this aloud in the congregation. Many smiled or laughed in recognition as they remembered the special teachers whom they had shared in Norfolk.

Guests in worship were Rev. Darrell Goodwin with his husband Norfolk native, Kenny Goodwin-Brice, and his mom and Darrell's "Mother-in-love", Delisa Brice Monroe. About the visit, and on the topic of teachers, Rev. Goodwin wrote on a Facebook page:

"Grateful to visit with our siblings at First Congregational United Church of Christ in Norfolk, NE in the Nebraska Conference UCC this morning. It was also a joy to have Kentavis Goodwin-Brice see so many of his former teachers who were members of this congregation, especially as they were honoring teachers this Sunday. Thanks Rev. Jackie Perry for the warm welcome. The United Church of Christ is .5 degrees of separation wherever you are."


Pastor's Time Away


Congo Mission: Orphan Grain Train Shipment ARRIVES!



Abiba "Alice" Shomarii, in June 2021, FCUCC donated 130-150 choir robes, about 80 children's chairs, about 80 brown vinyl folding chairs and a chair cart to Bethlehem UMC and Emmanuel Pentecostal Churches in Kasumbalesa. Democratic Republic of Congo. "Pastor Alice" moved with her family to Kansas in July 2021, but she continued to work with Orphan Grain Train and her partners to get the shipment to the churches. Worldwide shipping delays and DRC governmental permission delayed the shipment for two years. In May, Pastor Alice sent photos and a video of the churches using many of the contributed items in their new worship space for Easter 2023!






