

Retreat

Jesus said to them, "Come away with me. Let us go alone to a quiet place and rest for a while."



February 10-12, I attended the Clergy Wellness Retreat at St. Benedict's Retreat Center near Schuyler for authorized ministers of the UCC and Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Nebraska. It was an opportunity for fellowship, renewal, and continuing education for all clergy and their spouse/partners. This year, the UCC Pension Board covered meals and lodging.

Rev. Darrell Goodwin (Omaha), Associate Conference Minister for Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota Confer-

ences gave the keynote reminding ministers that often those who serve others ("fix a plate"), can forget that they "deserve a plate", too. Speakers presented wellness skills including mindfulness, boundaries and harassment in the workplace, financial planning, and working through stressful and changing times. Rev. Chris Morton (DOC) led the closing worship and communion. The retreat fulfills requirements for mandatory Boundaries Training for UCC pastors every three years.

Monday's sunny drive to Schuyler proved ice-free. On Tuesday, being warm enough to walk outside, I went searching for the new labyrinth. I understand that members of the Five-Day Spiritual Academy had plotted and dug the path, while the groundskeeper at the retreat center laid the stonework.

As I walked the stone labyrinth, I discovered one stone paver held a wavy line. Was this perhaps a petrified pathway formed by some tiny creature? Was this ancient line traced by one living being, or was it like a deer-path created by several animals over time? Was this trail trodden thousands, or millions of years ago? It was a small joy to be so connected, for a brief time, to the Eternal through the trace actions of some ancient critter and one good groundskeeper.






