SPIRITUAL PRACTICE

As a spiritual practice for Lent, many of us are doing the "Lenten Prayer/Reflection Sheet" discard

(available for free in the Narthex). Each day of Lent, I draw a word from 40 words that have been cut apart and placed in a mason jar. I wait for the Spirit to speak to me through that word, and a message usually comes that day (or later

that week).

Today as I write, my word is 'discard'. It can mean throw out, get rid of, dump, ditch, scrap, adios! The word speaks to me about the practice of repentance and forgiveness. What baggage is God inviting me to ditch, so I can receive God's gift of mercy and forgiveness?

As I go through physical therapy for 'Runner's Knee' this month, I must say 'adios' to my over-rated, self-sufficient streak to accept the help I need from the highly skilled and kind physical therapists.

Since starting PT, I have drawn other cards such as 'flesh', and 'pruning' (twice I drew 'pruning'. Enough with the pruning!)

'Discard' can also mean 'to play a card'. I'm reminded that I am invited to play the cards I am dealt each day and play them as faithfully as I am able. We never know what joy or hardship cards life will deal us; but what is for certain, *God is with us* guiding us to play the next card toward healing and wholeness.

Be it the prayer card, waiting card, fight or flight card, acceptance card, or whatever card, God encourages me to keep moving forward one step at a time. – Peace, *Pastor Jackie*








OGHS Sharing Calendar—Let Love Flow


