## **Tree Planting**



In April, we received a beautiful gift of a 'bald cypress' tree from the Arbor Day Foundation in partnership with the Nebraska Conference of the United Church of Christ. Sue Shear, a Conference board member, and her husband delivered the tree to Home for Funerals. Thanks to Erik Gamerl for the drop off. Erik called Norfolk Parks Department to see if the tree could be planted at one of the parks in town. Within a few short days, the city had taken care of everything and Jane Uzzell and Verletta Olson met me out at Skyview Park for a tree planting blessing. Erik ordered a plaque from the city that will have the type of tree

printed on it and the words: 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary / First Congregational UCC / Arbor Day Foundation. I thought it was cool that the Arbor Day Foundation has been inspiring people to plant trees as long as we have been a church!

It was fun to see that the city had planted it near the water. Did I mention that this is a 'swamp tree'? All the trees donated to the 50 churches were raised in Nebraska, and we learned back in 2019 that most of Nebraska is indeed a floodplain! There is only one other bald cypress at the park. A large handsome fellow growing on the south shore, with wide reaching branches. You will find that mature tree as you walk from the parking lot toward the bridge.

To find our tree, go behind the big shelter house near the playground, then walk in the direction of the water tower, and you will find it growing near the water. Here are the Scripture passages that we read for the blessing:

**Psalm 1** Happy are those who delight in God's law, they are like trees planted by streams of water.

Isaiah 55 Instead of a thorn, shall come up a cypress.John 15:1 Jesus is the true vine.

At the delivery, Sue Shear told Erik that none of the churches had received their first choice (we had requested a birch or an oak). God sending a cypress to discouraged exiles is a meaningful image. May this tree continue to give our community hope and beauty through the years.




