

Nourishing the Seed of Faith!: The Small Church Advantage



On Saturday, October 21, Verletta Olson, David Thompson, and Pastor Jackie participated in the Fall Gathering of the Living Waters Association of the Nebraska Conference, United Church of Christ. St. Luke's UCC in Columbus hosted, and Joan Alexander of Plainview UCC lead events.

In the morning all worshipped, followed by speaker, Rev. Roberto Ochoa, UCC Minister for Ethnic Inclusion and Congregational Support for Rural and Small Churches. He's based in Cleveland at the national setting of the UCC.

The keynote speaker was Teresa J. Stewart, author of "The Small Church Advantage". Her observation of small and big

churches has revealed that "Small congregations are not big places in miniature. They work differently. They come with different resources, dynamics, and challenges. But they also come with distinctive strengths—ones that are powerfully forming and not generally available in big settings."

"Rather than chasing after one-size-fits-most programs, ministry requires more than trying to replicate big-setting successes. It requires unleashing this great variety of small-setting strengths."

One principle that she highlighted is "*The greater the participation, the greater the formation*". At FCUCC in Norfolk, it seems that everyone participates in some way. One way we hope to put this principle into practice is through the Christmas Program and potluck scheduled for December 10. The Christmas program theme is: *Memories of Christmas.* Yet, another creative Christmas idea from our own Mike Synovec. Between now and mid-November, we will be collecting <u>your memories of Christmas</u> in a variety of ways. See more in this newsletter about how you can share your *Memories of Christmas*.

2023 Pack Away Hunger

On October 15, eleven folks from FCUCC packed nutritious meals for Mercy Meal's annual event, Pack Away Hunger. The group packed bags of soy, rice, dried vegetables, chicken flavoring and nutrients; weighed the bags, sealed, labeled, and packed them into cardboard boxes. In an hour and a half, our team packed 16 boxes with 36 bags in each. Since each bag will feed six people that comes out to 3,456 meals! According to a Mercy Meal's Facebook post, the 2022 Pack Away Hunger meal total was 105,742 meals. Orphan Grain Train delivers the meals all over the United States and the world.

Congregational Meeting, October 22, 2023.

Meeting was called to order by Vice Moderator, Brian Seier. Quorum was declared. A Congregational meeting has been called by Support Ministry to discuss reglazing and painting the no-stained glass windows on the north side of the church. One bid is for \$12,000, and the other is for \$6425. The meeting is to be held after worship on October 22, 2023.


The floor was open: The differences in amounts was questioned and explained. The higher bid is a bid to not do the job. It is not uncommon in construction to do so. The low is from Andrew Liking, the son of the gentleman who painted the windows on the west side of the educational building. He now has his own construction company. The caulking will be taken off, recaulked and repainted. Brian Seier explained the extensive process. It is not the stained glass windows. What is the plan to do there? The plan is to get to those first—the ones on the stairs up to the balcony and the ones by the sacristy. There are 72 of the little panes that will need to be done. Others were contacted to bid. Glass Edge never got back to us. Binswager bid the \$12,000. Ben Uzzell contacted Andrew Liking. Scott Williams contacted another party which did not respond.

We have enough in our savings and in endowment to cover the cost. The Memorial committee has also been contacted. It may come from all 3 sources. Ben Uzzell, Support, personal feelings is to take it from 1st Memorial fund, 2nd endowment, both of which are not interest bearing. The endowment is, but what it makes goes into the cash portion. Every 5 years it is evaluated as to what to do with it. There was discussion and concern about this, which Ben said would be discussed at a later Support meeting.

Concern was raised that if moisture is coming into the clear panes, is it not also affecting the stained glass windows along the sanctuary. The question was raised, "Do you want to back up and get a bid for it all?" The plan is to fix these of high need now and then move to the others when these have been fixed. It's not the stained glass window itself, it's the outside covering window. The advantage in doing it in stages is to get a sense of what it takes and make plans to fix the stained glass windows next. The quality of the work can also be evaluated
