Annual Meeting, April 18, 2021 We do not have a quorum. Meeting is postponed to next Sunday, April 25, 2021

Annual Meeting was called to order on April 25, 2021, by Moderator Tom McConnell at 11 a.m. A quorum was declared present.

Reverend Jackie Perry opened the meeting with prayer.

Chuck Balsiger motioned to blanket accept the following yearly reports as written: Congregational Meeting Minutes, Pastor's Report, Clerk's Report, Historian's Report, Cradle Roll, Faith Development Ministry, Worship Ministry, Transformation Ministry, and Financial Reports from Youth Fund, Gift Cards, Kitchen Fund, Scholarship, Restricted Endowment, Madison County Bank, the Memorial Fund, Treasurer's Report and the General Fund (added and available the day of the first meeting, April 18, 2021). Scott Williams seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Pastor's Moment--Reverend Jackie Perry: Pastor Jackie has seen the goodness of God in the past year. We have navigated the past year with graciousness. She is thankful for our relationship with Linaje. Grateful for the first responders, and the technology. A highlight for her was to record the Thanksgiving Psalm for the joint Thanksgiving virtual worship with the Episcopal and Methodist churches. She has not heard back on the application for the grant for improving the church's technology. The Worship Team would like to return, if possible, to fellowship time, coffee only, in June. The Worship Team will also revisit how and when to return to worshipping in Fellowship Hall in June. The 150th anniversary team is moving forward with a planned outdoor concert by *Touch of Brass* in August. The bald cypress tree from the Arbor Foundation and the Nebraska UCC has been planted at Skyview Lake, south of the main shelter on the playground side of the lake.

Vote on the Proposed Budget: Moderator Tom McConnell opened a discussion on the budget. Tom asked Lori Williams to speak to pg. 22. The expenses for the past year are easy to budget for due to their consistencies. What cannot be budgeted for is revenue. The bottom line is that we are a small but mighty church. If every

family unit would give \$10 more a month, we would reach our proposed budget. There was a question about the lightning strike hitting the computers, was that turned into insurance? It was below our deductible, so it was not.

Scott Williams spoke about the meeting with Linaje concerning the renewal of our agreement to rent them the lower level of the church building. Barb Koenig, Randy Neuharth were our other representatives at the meeting. Linaje loves being here. Rent will be raised to \$900 a month.

Between the PPP loan, which is now 100% forgiven, the Linaje rental arrangement, and the generosity of our congregation, we did well.

A question was raised concerning Pg 18. It addresses that the year end financial sheet is on a separate sheet. It was available, on the table in the Narthex.

Verletta Olson reported: 22 pledges have been turned in. Pledges for ourselves \$106,630, for others \$6,404. As of April 18, amount pledged: \$115,040. There are 3 or 4 members' outstanding pledge cards, and they typically do so. So the end result is that the proposed \$120,000 budget is possible. A motion to accept the report was made by Ben Uzzell, 2nded by Sue Surber. Motion passed.

Nominations for church offices was reviewed. Officers Randy Neuharth, Moderator, Eric Gamerl, Vice Moderator, Tom McConnell, Past Moderator, Jane Uzzell, Clerk, and Lori Williams, Treasurer. Scott Williams motioned to accept. Sue Surber, 2nded. Motion passed.

Reverend Jackie Perry led the Commissioning of Officers, as found on page 22. To our knowledge there are no changes in the church's teams. The Unity Council members are changed as Moderator officers move to their new positions. Thanks were given to Moderator Tom McConnell as he moves to Past Moderator.

There are a number of committees/teams looking for people to help. Please check the bulletin board and step forward to help.

Ben Uzzell motioned that the meeting be adjourn. Sue Surber seconded the motion. Meeting was adjourned at 11:16 a.m..

Closing Prayer by Reverend Jackie Perry. A moment of silence was offered, followed by Pastor Jackie's prayer.

Congregational Meeting, Sept. 19, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 10:57 a.m. by Moderator Randy Neuharth.

Pastor Jackie opened the meeting with prayer.

A quorum, of at least 25, was declared present.

Motion: Proposal: "Quorum: A quorum at any duly called congregational meeting shall be twenty (20) members." So moved by Ben Uzzell. Seconded by Scott Williams. Motion carried.

Ben Uzzell motioned to adjourn. Ed Lindsay seconded. Meeting adjourned at 11 a.m.

A discussion of the church's financial issues was held, led by our treasurer, Lori Williams. She referred the members to the Balance sheet: The church's current balance is \$5400 because the amount shown includes memorial monies that need to be transferred out of the general fund. In August, funds were transferred out of the Edward Jones spendable portion. A memorial was also received in August. Lori then referred the members to the P & L statement: On this report, the amount under "ourselves pledges" is the one thing we, as members, control in our revenue stream. Our pledges are down about \$5,000. Thank you for your current pledge, but we, Support Team, Worship Team, and Faith Development Team do need to look at possibly cutting expenses, but also, please consider giving a pinch more so we can meet our budget. There being no questions, the members were dismissed from the sanctuary.

Pastor's Annual Report 2022

"They showed us unusual kindness". (cf. Acts 28:2)

The spike in Covid-19 cases in January, as well as sharp increases in gas prices and inflation this winter seemed to bring out more stories of incivility, intolerance and ill-dispositions. If covid-fever couldn't wear us down, these stories could!

In the dark days of winter, the wider United Church of Christ and Presbyterian minister, Bruce Reyes-Chow, offered webinars on kindness and civility. "Sign me up!", I thought. In addition, I took a free training sponsored by the Center for Rural Affairs on "Civity". "Civity" is like the word civility but means *the relationships among citizens in a city.* In March, many community leaders were invited to workshops at Northeast and Norfolk Public Library sponsored by Norfolk Area Pride with support from Northeast and Daycos. Like the other workshops, the events provided practical tools to intentionally connect with people who are different.

Between our Lenten practice this year of *sharing stories of kindness* and my participation in these uplifting presentations, I have received affirmations that God is good; God's creation is good; and we are all children of God. Also, that our church's values of <u>caring</u>, <u>compassion and welcome</u> make a difference as we intentionally live them out in Norfolk and the world.

How can the church counter *the despair* that sets in when people repeat stories meant to tear down and divide?

- -Listen and reflect on the gospel.
- -Share your stories of kindness with everyone (they are awesome!)
- -Continue to adapt and show openness to God and others.

When I read in this "Annual Report" Bonnie Kroeger's summary of all that we have been and done as a church through a 2nd challenging year in a world-wide pandemic, I am filled with gratitude to God to be part of this faith community.

Since coming to Norfolk First Congregational United Church of Christ eight and a half years ago, I have had the joy of working with great leaders. It seems that the Spirit calls the right people to serve at the right times. All these leaders have been thoughtful people of faith with different gifts and perspectives to share. They have helped the church remain faithful and vital. You continue to encourage and inspire.

April 2021—March 2022—Church History

APRIL 1st — Maundy Thursday with Communion—not a joint service due to Covid-19. Masks are still encouraged to be worn. 4th — Easter. Holy Communion continues to be served in the Narthex after service. 11th — Worship. 18th — Annual Meeting postponed until the 25th due to lack of a quorum (need 25 voting members). 14th — Book Club met in Fellowship Hall and read Ants in Your Pants, Worms in Your Plants. A Cypress tree was received from the Arbor Day Foundation in partnership with the Nebraska Conference of the UCC. Verletta Olson, Jane Uzzell and Pastor Jackie, with the help of the Norfolk Parks Department, found a place it could be planted which was at Skyview Park. Erik Gamerl ordered a plaque that has the type of tree and the words "150th Anniversary/First Congregational UCC/Arbor Day Foundation." (The Cypress is a "swamp tree" and we learned that most of Nebraska is indeed in a floodplain)! Our tree can be found behind the big shelter house near the playground. Walk in the direction of the water tower, you will find it growing near the water. One of the Scripture blessings that were read was Isaiah 55 -"Instead of a thorn, shall come up a Cypress". 25th — Annual Meeting. Those attending from our church were Pastor Jackie Perry, Jane Uzzell, Bonnie Dewell, Verletta Olson, Gene & Bonnie Kroeger, Randy Neuharth and Scott Williams. ANNUAL REPORT OF FAITH DEVELOPMENT MINISTRY TEAM

April 2021-March 2022

The Faith Development Ministry Team of First Congregational United Church of Christ in Norfolk, Nebraska meets as needed on Sundays following regular church service; this year we met four times. Members include: Katie Gamerl, Barb Koenig (Council Representative), Darlene Korthals (Presiding Chairman), Kay Neuharth (Secretary), Stacie Uzzell, and Pastor Jackie Perry.

We continue to provide educational opportunities and currently have Sunday School classes for lower and upper elementary school students. These classes meet at 9:00 am prior to church services. A book club for adults meets monthly on the second Wednesday morning at 10 am.

Pastor Jackie and volunteers have continued to provide various activities and outreach projects for our youth. These have included: making Saint Patrick's Day bags for residents at the Countryside Home in Madison, volunteering at the Animal Shelter, helping to deliver donated items to the Orphan Grain Train, organizing a church food drive for the Norfolk Community Food Pantry, planning and cooking a meal to deliver to the Rescue Mission, making valentines for our friends at Skyline Apartments, as well as taking part in church services.

Gradually, as COVID restrictions have changed, we have been able to have more regular events this church year. *Teacher Appreciation Day* was held on Sunday, May 2, 2021. *Rally Day*, initiating the start of the 2021-2022 Sunday School year, was held on Sunday, September 12, 2021. Introduction of teachers/substitutes was made during church services. Bags of cookies were provided following service. Two regular events, *Vacation Bible School*, and *the Annual Easter Egg Hunt*, did not occur.

Special events were also held this year. *Ash Wednesday and Easter Services* were held. Our *high school graduates,* Tayler Rossman and Adam Gamerl, were recognized and honored on May 9, 2021. Youth and adults participated in the annual *Christmas program,*" Little Drummer Boy," written by Mike Synovec, on December 19, 2021. Santa and Mrs. Claus made their appearance following the program. The *Mitten Tree* was decorated with donated hats, gloves, and underwear which were later given to Jefferson Elementary. *Christmas caroling* was canceled.

Upcoming events include: possible *Youth Outreach* event at Fur Babies in Norfolk in May, the *Annual Easter Egg Hunt* scheduled for Saturday, April 9th, *Graduation Recognition* for Cole Uzzell on May 1st, *Teacher Appreciation Day* on May 8th, and the last day of *Sunday School on* May 8th. *Vacation Bible School* plans have not yet been confirmed.

Covid-19 response was discussed every month. Recommendations were for masking and social distancing in the sanctuary. Communion was served in the narthex to family groups individually dismissed by the ushers. March 2022 the numbers in Madison County indicated the ability to return to closer to normal activity, so the recommendation is to move services to Fellowship Hall after Easter.

May 2021 Nurturing women were recognized with a carnation and graduates given a blessing during worship.

June 2021 Pastor Alice Shamari was guest preacher to share the blessings of our donations of choir robes and chairs to the Congo mission. Nurturing men were recognized with "Pop for Pop." Coffee fellowship returned with beverages only.
