Suffering

Lent has been a season to take stock of our lives. In March, "kindness" has been our watch word. We have been sharing stories of kindness and civility, and there is no shortage of these satisfying stories.

As the season has progressed, I have also observed what author and former kindergarten teacher, Vivian Paley, discovered. After years of researching *the kindness of children*, she wrote that stories of kindness do three things:

they move us to want to do kind things;

ordinary people show up and know what to do; and

nice stories relax us and help us make connections.

Indeed, the stories I have heard and shared had all three of these characteristics.

Stories of human kindness and mercy (undeserved kindness) are also a reflection of God's kindness and mercy. Encouraged by these stories, I feel better prepared to turn the corner, and follow Jesus as he enters Jerusalem to meet his fate.

But, are we ever fully prepare to hear again the story of Jesus' suffering--from his friends betrayal to his torturous death? It's heavy, and often I feel the weight of it as we approach Good Friday.

For me, feeling the weight of Jesus' suffering can help me connect to the gravity of the suffering of others. Realizing that Jesus, the Son of God, suffered, helps me to connect with my own need to connect with God and others when I suffer.

Perhaps our watch word for April might be "suffering". May we be aware of those of us who suffer, pray for relief from suffering, and ask God to show us how we might ease suffering. Peace, *Pastor Jackie*


