Norfolk Area Pride is hosting the first ever Pride Festival in Norfolk Saturday, September 18, 3PM – 6PM at the Norfolk Art Center. The event will feature family friendly events including Bounce Houses, Live Music, Zumba Class, Food Trucks, Craft Projects, LGBTQ+ Educational Panels and more.

News Channel Nebraska featured the group in June, which was Pride Month. Here are some quotes from the story:

"Over 18 million Americans identify as LGBTQ and around 3 million live in rural communities, according to Gallup and the study from the Movement Advancement Project"

"Our identity is not talked about, "said Mo Bailey, Vice President of Norfolk Area Pride. "For a long time, it's been a don't ask, don't tell type community".

"A member of the pride group tells us her son moved out of state to be in a more welcoming city."

"When my youngest son came out, I had nowhere to go, no one to talk to," Sue Weaver.

"The group's goal is for people to know they're not alone."

In the spring of 2014, sixty people gathered for a meal at homes, Fellowship Hall, or restaurants to share stories about First Congregational Church members past and present. We called the event 'Around the Table'. As presider, I posed a question, took notes, distributed a list of 88 values after the stories were told, and recorded the number of times participants named a value that they heard embedded in a story. The question: Tell a story of a time when you saw a member of the congregation do something that touched you [was meaningful and memorable for you]. The goal was to identify our values.

Of 30 values named, three surpassed them all: <u>caring, compassion, and welcome</u>. The people who have touched you as a congregation, embodied these values. We know Jesus gave concrete form to these values. I'm looking forward to attending this event and seeing you there. Serving with love and faith, *Pastor Jackie*
