My favorite way to pray is in color. A few years ago, I discovered the book *Praying in Color: Drawing a New Path to God*, by Sybil MacBeth. In the book the author shows examples of how to create prayers from a prayer list. Your list may be in your head or on paper. Macbeth encourages folk to create simple doodles by drawing triangles, circles, and rectangles, then fill in the shapes with a name. If you like to doodle and sometimes fumble with words for prayer, give this a try.

I discovered that simple mandalas work great for this practice. Mandalas originated from various eastern religions to aid in meditation. They have become popular in recent years. For use in prayers, I google "simple mandalas" and click "images". I find a free one and print it out or cut and paste the image if I want to shrink the size.

I use colored markers or colored pencils. When I complete one, I might date it and tuck it away in a little sketch/prayer book I keep or mail them to a person on the list.

This is an example of one from our weekly prayer list with a few additional names and words that came to mind. There are many ways to pray without words. This method helps me to bring people to mind and hold them up to God.

In February, I will leave a few mandalas printed for use at church or to take home. Whether you keep them or mail them to someone, they are kind of like valentines to God.




Plowing Our Spirits


