

Topics around Race – It's not news to anyone that we are living in a time of conflict, division, and disagreement. We are a people who can't seem to find a way out of the "us vs. them" pit. It does not matter who you think is "us" and who is "them". We all feel stuck.

How does the church share their faith and offer hope in times like these? On June 24, a small group and Pastor Jackie met to discuss ways First Congregational might faithfully respond to recent events around topics of injustice, race, and police reform. Participants volunteered to review a group resource on dialog as a starting point. The group may also explore various books and movies and check out the library for suggestions. A couple people shared engaging editorials from various newspapers that named the issues and called for change.

Pastor Jackie reminded the church that we have had difficult conversations in the recent past and "they didn't tear up our relationships". Instead, these intentional conversations moved us more toward unity even while we held diverse perspectives. As in the past, we can use dialog techniques that help us talk with each other with kindness and respect. The group plans to meet again later in July.

FCUCC Funeral Guidelines in the Season of Covid-19



Covid-19 has disrupted our usual patterns of daily life and worship. On June 22, Worship Team discussed and approved new Covid-19 season guidelines for funeral/memorial services at FCUCC. For the complete guidelines, ask Sue Allyn for a copy.

Summary - People have several choices when it comes to funeral or memorial services. They may choose to hold: a graveside service and/or schedule a memorial service later, a service and visitation at a funeral home, or a service and visitation at First Congregational UCC. As an option, we encourage families to consider holding visitations at the funeral home the day before.

Though the church may request that people wear masks, we understand most may not, which makes social distancing even more important. With social distancing in place, we may accommodate these numbers:

Sanctuary Up to 70 people Balcony Up to 10 people

Fellowship Hall Up to 50 people (for overflow: audio/speaker only)

We would rely on funeral home staff for the number of ushers needed. And at this time, receptions and food sharing are not permitted. Be assured, at the time of planning a funeral or memorial service your church and funeral home will work with you to create a meaningful service.

Funerals and memorial services are worship services. That we may live out our values of caring, compassion, and welcome, we ask guests, friends, and members to maintain these healthy practices as we do for Sunday worship:

- Please wear a mask throughout the service, and while you are in the building
- Social distancing 6 feet minimum between family groups
- Arrival and dismissal will encourage social distancing
- Come directly into the sanctuary when you arrive, and distance outside after the service
 if you wish to visit
- Ask children to remain with parents or guardian
- No indoor social hour prior to the service
- No food sharing or receptions for a while


