#### **Mission**

Given our church's work this spring, I've been thinking about the word 'mission'. Mission originates from the Latin *missio*, from *mittere*, "to send". According to the *Westminster Dictionary of Theological Terms*, by Donald K. McKim, 'mission' means "all that is done by the church and by Christians to serve God." This is a pretty broad meaning.

Those who study mission (missiology), think about the missionary nature and action of the Christian church. Deep within the meaning of the word is the church's awareness of God's command to preach the name of Christ to the whole world and practice what that name means (Acts 1:8). The command comes from the very character of God who we learn from Scripture to be mission-minded and loving.

## The English word 'mission' points to a God who "sends" God's people to proclaim the good news.

Romans 10:15 "And how can they preach unless they are sent?" As it is written, *How beautiful are the feet of those who announce the good news."* [Isaiah 52:7].

John 20:21 "Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you."

#### God's love is always seeking and inviting all creation to God.

Luke 15:3,4 Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose someone among you had one hundred sheep and lost one of them. Wouldn't he leave the other ninety-nine in the pasture and search for the lost one until he finds it?"

John 12:32 "Don't be afraid, little flock, because your Father delights in giving you the kingdom."

# God's own activity in the world is mission.

When Jesus describes himself as "the gate of the sheep", he says:

**John 10:10** "The thief enters only to steal, kill, and destroy. I came so that they could have life—indeed, so that they could live life to the fullest."

The UCC purpose statement (from the Gospel of Mathew) is: To love God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength and our neighbor as ourselves. The church exists to increase love of God and neighbor. Mission is all our energy and action to that end. Peace, Pastor Jackie

The church was blessed to have Rev. Alice Abiba Shomari (Pastor Alice) preach Sunday June 6. She also shared her conversion story and ministry, inviting the church to move out and share the good news with family, community and world.

In June, FCUCC donated 130 choir robes, some 80 children's chairs, and some 80 brown vinyl folding chairs to Bethlehem UMC and Emmanuel Pentecostal Churches in Kasumbalesa, Congo (D.R.C.), a small southern border town near Zambia. Pastor Alice partners with Orphan Grain Train to ship the mission's container.

Pastor Alice, husband Rev. Rodgers Chishiba, and family move this month from Osmond to serve UMC churches in Kansas.

#### Mission is Friendship





In June, First Congregational and Linaje Escogido Churches worked together on a Saturday cleanup day. Over a dozen members of each church pulled weeds, swept, cleaned window wells, and dug a new drainage system near the kitchen door. Two weeks later both churches experienced loss and held funerals in the sanctuary. The grounds looked beautiful and welcoming for all who attended those services.

#### **Covid-19 Guidelines Update**

On June 13, 2021 Unity Council approved the recommendations proposed by Worship Team:

#### Worship to remain in sanctuary for now.

**Masking** – Masking is a choice. Free masks will continue to be gifted to those who want one.

**Spacing & Distancing** Tape comes down, except near the planist. In building and sanctuary use your discretion in distancing.

Keep passing the peace as is.

Children to remain with parents for now.

No sharing of objects; keep offering as is. If signing cards, a pen is available, or folk can carry their own pen ("like elementary school teachers have done forever!", says Mike).

<u>Communion</u> continues as is for now except with real bread, served with gloved hand; and more trays with cups spaced more widely to allow folk to take cups from trays without touching others.

Ushers dismiss family units back to front on communion Sundays. Otherwise, folk can use their discretion at dismissal.

**Food/Beverage Service** – See *Fellowship Time* below.

<u>Data & Vaccines</u>— Pastor Jackie presented data updates from Nebraska and Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health websites and "Situational Reports" for leaders. Madison County has been in the <u>Green Zone</u> (Low/Stable) for 4 weeks in a row. 50% of Nebraskans have been vaccinated. Vaccinations have slowed down.

<u>Theological</u> - Christian principals remain: Do unto others, and care for the neighbor. We value protecting others and self.

<u>Timeframe</u> – Worship remains in the sanctuary for now. <u>The team scheduled to meet September 1st at 10am to re-evaluate moving worship to Fellowship Hall.</u>

<u>Fellowship Time</u> – Fellowship hour opened June 6. Volunteers are signed up for first 3 weekends in June to make coffee, set out juice and water. For Fellowship time after worship beverages in ceramic cups (to save \$ on paper), no food for a while. Cups need to go into dishwasher. Team will encourage people to rinse their own cup and set it on the dishwasher tray. We recommend 4-5 people at a table for distancing and not to leave someone 'out'.

**Funerals** – See below.

**Funeral Guidelines Update.** There are fewer changes as these are larger gatherings:

**Masking** – We change the current wording from "request" masks to "encourage" masks. Masks will continue to be available for those who want one.

**Spacing** – Continue funeral guideline spacing and numbers. Funeral Home Ushers to encourage people to space as per the guidelines. For funerals, blue tape would help ushers.


