- -Greeter will hold the door open so no one has to touch door handles
- -Encourage worshippers to wear a face mask
- -Ask children to remain with parents or guardian
- -No indoor social hour prior to or after the service.
- -No passing of offering trays (there will be a basket at the main sanctuary exit)
- -No gatherings in Fellowship Hall or food sharing for a while


