

Rivers of Wickedness On the Uvalde School Shooting, May 24, 2022

Psalm 18:1-2a, 4-6 (CEB)

"He said: I love you, Lord, my strength. The Lord is my solid rock, my fortress, my rescuer."

"Death's cords were wrapped around me; rivers of wickedness terrified me. The cords of the grave surrounded me; death's traps held me tight. In my distress I cried out to the Lord; I called to my God for help. God heard my voice from his temple; I called to him for help, and my call reached his ears."

According to Education Week, there have been 27 school shootings this year.* *Rivers of wickedness.*

On my drive home to Southeast Iowa, I travel through Des Moines—a city where I discovered my call to ministry. Driving on the highway that cuts west to east through DM, I pass the Iowa State Capital on the right, and then East High School on the left. I always look up at the red East High sign because my old college roommate went to East—a small connection. When I arrived home to SE Iowa on March 7th, I learned on the news that three students were shot at East High that same day. Later six teenagers would be charged for killing one student and injuring two others.

Rivers of wickedness.

As I think about the latest school shooting in Uvalde, Texas *yesterday* that killed nineteen school children and two teachers, I think of my sister (a school teacher) and all the children I know. We don't have to personally know the Texas victims, to feel sad and angry over another senseless human-made disaster.

A child's spirit cries out.

First Responders held a disaster drill yesterday in Norfolk that included other responders in the region, the hospital, and the school. The school even asked the High School Drama Club and their friends to take part as 'injured bus riders'. The Emergency Manager for Region 11, Bobbi Riser, said in a news report that these emergency drills are important to area agencies to learn how to best coordinate with one another."

A child's spirit cries out.

As I searched Scriptures today, Psalm 18 seems to reflect the grief I feel, and so gives me comfort. The Psalmist sings, "In my distress I cried out to the Lord; I called to my God for help. God heard my voice from his temple; I called to him for help, and my call reached his ears." *Will it reach ours?*

Might First Responders and Emergency Managers give us a clue as to the importance of "learning each other's ways and personalities; and allowing everyone to effectively work together in chaotic situations"? As a church, we are to be doing whatever God is doing. Psalm 18:16 states what God does:

"From on high, God reached down and grabbed me; he took me out of all that water." *How might the church help to pull people out of all that water? How might the church help to pull our country out of all that water?*

Spiritual questions we might ponder in June. *Peace, Pastor Jackie*




