

"They showed us unusual kindness". (cf. Acts 28:2)

Phyllis Ames shares her story of kindness, as told to daughter, Char.

A kindness that I remember well was extended to us by the Congregational Church when we first moved to Norfolk from Hartington, NE. We were members of the Congregational Church in Hartington and when we moved to Norfolk, our minister contacted Norfolk's Congregational Church to let them know we were coming so they were waiting for us and our new family.

Dear Church Members and Friends,

On Sunday, **April 3<sup>rd</sup>**, **we will celebrate Stewardship Sunday** at First Congregational Church. This is when we invite you to place in the offering basket your envelope containing your Pledge Card and Time & Talent Sheet for the coming church year. The theme this year centers on our *rootedness*. In the spring, we know that plant shoots need roots to grow. It seems to me that roots hold two meanings. # Stewardship Sunday will be April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022






