

## Interfaith

They'll work A T I V E in the garden together, play together on the playground, and attend

one another's place of worship. Tri-Faith is a legacy for our grandchildren." -- Vic Gutman, President, Gutman & Associates, Omaha

I love getting to know neighbors of other faiths. Inter-religious relationships are one of God's special callings in our time. While the Church has always lived among a rich diversity of different faiths, in our global world today it is more visible than ever.

The National Council of Churches publishes a brochure called "Getting to Know Neighbors of Other Faiths". It highlights eight theological reasons why Christians would value people of other faiths. Topics include:

- --God and human community --Person and work of Christ
- --Hospitality to strangers
- --Spirit of God and human hope
- --Loving God and neighbor
- --Reconciliation with God

- --Peacemakers
- --Christian witness and reconciliation with others

As a Christian and Nebraskan, I rejoice that the Tri-Faith Initiative campus exists in Omaha! Go to trifaith.org to learn more. Not only can you visit, but you can take part in some of their online programs. Today I took part in a study they call, "Making the Familiar Strange: The Story of Sacrifice" with UNO Professor and Islamic Institute Member, Dr. Ramazan Kilinc.

The purpose of the series is to look at Scripture together from the Abrahamic tradition; where the Bible, Torah, and Koran share stories of Abraham. The one-hour lunchtime zoom is a respectful sharing of perspectives and consideration of new perspectives. The goal is not to agree or persuade.

Today we looked at the story of sacrifice concerning Abraham. Compared to Genesis 22, there are few details in The Koran 37:99-111. We don't even know which son is to be sacrificed (Isaac or Ishmael). There are many differences in the Muslim version. In all three traditions, the story is disturbing, and raises ethical questions. Professor Kilinc graciously asked participants to share their understanding, then shared the two Islamic versions. He doesn't advocate a preferred interpretation, but asks as a political scientist, why one of these versions is promoted and the other of these is pushed aside. You don't have to be a Bible scholar or a pastor to join these sessions. Ask me how you can subscribe to Tri-Faith announcements, and take part in some unique opportunities to witness, love and serve "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Peace, Pastor Jackie

## Congo Mission & Orphan Grain Train Shipment

Last June 2021, FCUCC donated 130 choir robes, some 80 children's chairs, and some 80 brown vinyl folding chairs and chair cart to Beth-

lehem UMC and Emmanuel Pentecostal Churches in Kasumbalesa, Congo (D.R.C.), a small southern border town near Zambia. Pastor Alice Shomari partners with Orphan Grain Train to ship the mission's containers.

Global supply chain and shipment problems caused delays last fall and this winter. The OGT hopes to ship the container this Spring. To save a costly border fee, Pastor Alice hopes they can deliver the container on the Zambia side of the border, so the churches can send a truck to pick up the donations. <u>Please pray</u> that the shipment issue is resolved.

About seven churches donated to fill this container. Pastor Alice said that the churches are excited to receive the chairs and choir robes. Right now, worshippers carry their own chairs to church, and carry them back home. One person said of our church, "Even the children helped!" They liked the pictures of the youth and children helping.

Pastor Alice will continue to update the pictures, so when the congregation receives the items, we will be able to see the robes and chairs in use! On the website, there is a Go Fund Me link if you wish to donate to the water project. Pastor Alice Shomari and her husband now serve UMC churches in Kansas.

Pastor Jackie said, "At a time when we thought we had little to give, we discovered that we had an abundance to give. We didn't even know that we had 150 choir robes."
