#### Simmering



"God has the answers; we bring the questions."

Many of you know by now that part of my faith formation was influenced by 5<sup>th</sup> generation Quaker minister, James Newby. Jim is the author of several books on spiritual formation. His most recent book is titled *Reflections from the Inner Light*, Resource Publishing, 2019.

In one chapter, Jim writes how as a young man, he was a distance runner. He misses those running days, but now walking gives him "much needed time for *simmering*". *Simmering walks* (he calls them) give him time to reflect on the day's activities and encounters with others.

To get closer to God, Quakers often create queries (spiritual questions) to take with them into the silence. Here are a few questions that Jim takes with him on his simmering walks:

"Am I using the sacred gift of time today in a meaningful way?"

"Have I been helpful in lifting human burdens today?"

"Have I been an encourager to those in need of encouragement?"

"What spiritual lessons am I learning from today's experiences?"

Jim's friend and author, Malcom Muggeridge, wrote, "Every happening great and small is a parable whereby God speaks to us, and the art of life is to get the message."

May we all seek ways to hear the message from the Still Speaking God. *Peace, Pastor Jackie*


