To highlight the church's 150th Anniversary Free Summer Concert, The Chamber of Commerce Ambassadors arrived on Wednesday morning, August 18th to congratulate the church and offer best wishes. Members of the red blazered brigade were curious about the church replica that Gene Krueger had built in 2016 for a parade float celebrating Norfolk's 150th anniversary. Verletta shared how the first pastor's wife, Mary Kidder, was involved with early education in our pioneer town. Gene told the story of the fateful fire of 1944.

About the fire, one ambassador commented, "That's amazing; you <u>held it together</u> after the fire for 6 years with no church building, and no internet!" I'd never heard it put quite that way and have been reflecting on this. In 1944, church membership was quite large, and many people were off to war. How did we communicate? How did we hold it together?

The ambassadors presented the church with a certificate that read: "May the confidence you have shown in this community and its economy be rewarded with a lifetime of success." I'm grateful for these words, and I would add these words of our faith:

"He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church... "(Colossians 1:17-18).

The confidence we have in Christ gives us the vision to see that Christ has always held us together.




